THE ROGER B. TRASK ADULT DAY **HEALTH PROGRAM—Care-Giving** Support -In Your Neighborhood We are a Day Health Program located, along with the Peabody Council on Aging, in the Peter A. Torigian Senior Center. Our Program is designed to provide a structured setting for individuals who would benefit from supervised care. We offer social and therapeutic activities, transportation, personal care, bi-lingual staff, medical monitoring, meals and snacks, as well as counseling and other social services. The Trask Program also offers many benefits for families and caregivers such as freedom from concern of leaving a loved one home alone, as well as needed respite time for caregivers to pursue their own activities. Services are provided by a Program Coordinator, Registered Nurses, Licensed Social Worker, Activities Coordinator, Certified Nursing Assistants, and Trained Volunteers. 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
