Medicare's: OPEN ENROLLMENT!

Starting this month! Open Enrollment is here!

If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO, PPO), you should have received information from your plan by the end of September. It is important to read and save this information because it explains the changes in your plan for 2022.

During Medicare's Annual Open Enrollment (October 15-December 7),

you will have a chance to change your plan for next year. If you never had a drug plan, this is your opportunity to join one. SHINE (Serving the Health Insurance Needs of Everyone...on Medicare) counselors can help you understand your plan changes, as well as explain other options you may have.



Trained SHINE counselors offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of Medicare and related health insurance programs. To schedule a phone appointment with the SHINE counselor here, please contact the PCOA at 978-531-2254.


THE ROGER B. TRASK ADULT DAY HEALTH PROGRAM

Are you concerned about leaving a loved one at home alone during the daytime hours? Could they (and you) benefit from a supervised, caring atmosphere? Come talk with us. We can help.

We are a *Day Health Program* located, along with the Peabody Council on Aging, in The Peter A. Torigian Senior Center. Our Program is designed to provide a structured setting for individuals who would benefit from supervised care. We offer social and therapeutic activities, transportation, personal care, bi-lingual staff, medical monitoring, meals and snacks, as well as counseling and other social services. The Trask Program also offers many benefits for families and caregivers such as freedom from concern of leaving a loved one home alone, as well as needed respite time for caregivers to pursue their own activities.

Services are provided by a Program Coordinator, Registered Nurses, Licensed Social Worker, Activities Coordinator, Certified Nursing Assistants, and Trained Volunteers. Medicare Savings Programs

From the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs and MassHealth

Want to Save money on your Medicare coverage?

A new state law in Massachusetts is expanding several Medicare Savings Programs (also known as "MassHealth Buyin" programs).

These programs help older residents and people living with disabilities save money on their Medicare coverage.

If you are a Massachusetts resident with limited income and assets, who is eligible for Medicare, you may qualify for a Medicare Savings Program that will pay out monthly Medicare Part B premium, which is now deducted from your Social Security benefit. In certain cases, a Medicare Savings program may also pay your out-of-pocket Medicare Part A and Part B costs and your Part A premium (if you have one).

It started on January 1, 2020...the Income and asset limits for the Medicare Savings Programs are increasing, meaning more people will be able to get help paying for Medicare.

If you qualify for a Medicare Savings Program you will also automatically qualify for <u>Extra Help</u>, a program that will help pay for your prescription drugs under Medicare.
