Medicare: OPEN ENROLLMENTI

It is almost here...Medicare's annual Open Enrollment

If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO, PPO), you should have received information from your plan by the end of September. It is important to read and save this information because it explains the changes in your plan for 2022.

During Medicare's Annual Open Enrollment (October 15-December 7),

you will have a chance to change your plan for next year. If you never had a drug plan, this is your opportunity to join one. SHINE (Serving the Health Insurance Needs of Everyone...on Medicare) counselors can help you understand your plan changes, as well as explain other options you may have.

<u>Counselors will only be available</u> for remote counseling over the phone.

Trained SHINE counselors offer free, confidential counseling on all aspects of Medicare and related health insurance programs.

Falls affect us all—whether personally or someone we love or care about. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, every second of every day an older adult falls. In 2015 alone, more than one in four older adults reported falling and more than 28,000 older adults died as a result of falls — that's 74 older adults every day.

There are simple steps you can take to prevent falls and decrease falls risks. CDC developed the STEADI (Stopping Elderly Accidents, Deaths & Injuries)

initiative which includes educational materials and tools to improve fall prevention.
